

The outstanding characteristics of the old course were severe cross-bunkers, now partly abolished, and remarkably large greens; many of these greens have now been made smaller by the construction of new hazards on their edges. While the changes may be both excellent and ingenious there will doubtless be some regrets at the loss of long familiar characteristics of the course.
