Leonard G. Crawley, the Old Cambridge cricket, golf and rackets Blue, and present Essex batsman, rather unexpectedly won the English Amateur Native Golf championship last Saturday at Hunstanton, when he beat the Irish Amateur champion, W. Sutton, of Timperley, at the 36th hole. As became a good cricketer Crawley played courageous golf throughout the week, "taking fortune's buffets and rewards with equal thanks." On the Friday he had beaten H. N. M. Fogg at the 19th and E. R. Tipple, who was expected to reach the final, at the 20th and his biggest margin of success during the championship was 3 and 2 up. The runner-up, W. Sutton, won this event in 1929.
