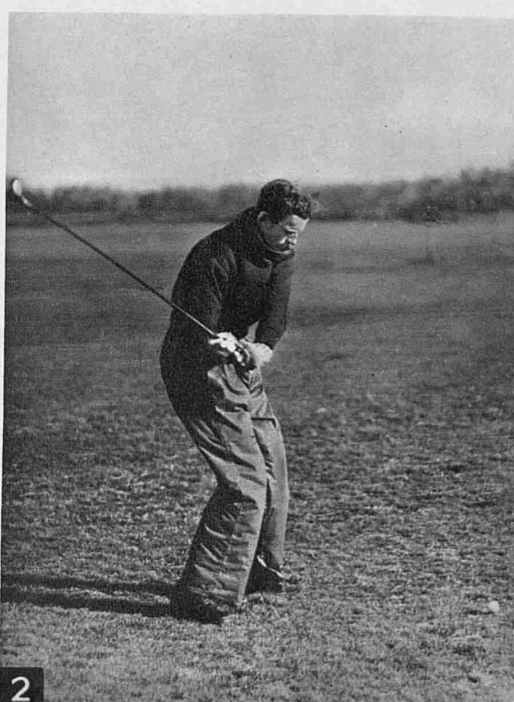
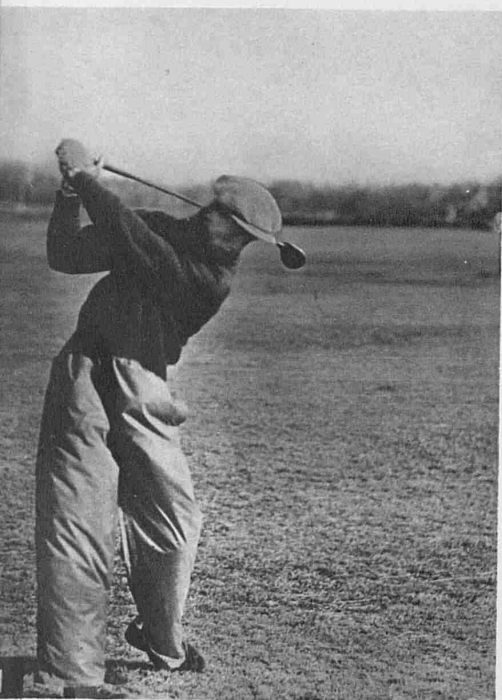

JOHAN GRAHAM, one of the sixteen Walker Cup possibles, has an ideal temperament and can be trusted to fight grimly till the very end. His medal rounds at Hoylake last season were the best sequence ever returned. He is a very powerful driver—sometimes he finds it difficult to hold a ball with a left-to-right wind—his iron-play is good and his putting fair.

- 1 At top of swing—note almost shut face—position otherwise orthodox—Graham uses a palm grip.
- 2 Half-way down—quite normal and solid.
- 3 Just before impact—left side rather weak—the palm grip can be seen here—head nice and steady.
- 4 After impact—head well down—left leg could be firmer, otherwise 100 p.c.
- 5 Another position after impact, obviously a different swing—left foot more turned towards the hole and leg still more bent—head and arms' positions good.
