Yet Wesley, who was successful at the twenty-third in the morning after the loss of five holes early on, played admirably composed golf- and like Jones was never behind. Much of his success was due to his admirable control through the green. Wesley's performance in winning his third-round match against W. P. M. His golf during the first seven holes had given no evidence that the initiative would be transferred to him so quickly. Warne challenged him with an excellent four at the long fourteenth but a good putt by Wesley at the fifteenth put the two on level terms again. His driving at this point had been of a high quality but at the twenty-first he hit his tee shot into the rough, his second was inadequate, and he was woeftilly short of the green in three.
