Cheshire drew their golf match with Lancashire at Royal Liverpool G.C., Hoylake, winning seven of the twelve singles after losing the foursomes 2-4.

Hoylake was in one of its most unfriendly moods, for a south-westerly wind blew with an uncomfortable fierceness throughout the day and control was extremely difficult. However, there was some good golf in spite of the conditions. M. J. Fearson, with his intimate knowledge of Royal Liverpool's moods, had a most successful day. In partnership with D. H. L. Shone, who is also a member there, he won his foursomes largely by a joint determination to keep the ball in play, and then later he beat B. Chinery, whose superior putting could not save him.

Cheshire won the top match more comfortably. I. R. Patey's golf was not as accomplished as Pearson's. but he always was more effective than D. Rawlinson in the shots up to the green. S. Mettam, the county champion, had some compensation for his heavy defeat in the foursomes in beating J. Taylor (Bolton), one of Lancashire's most reliable singles players, with a score of two over fours for the fourteen holes. L. J. Ranells, too, had similar figures when he finished his match against W. Nabb a hole earlier.

H. C. Humphreys, the Cheshire captain, had the unusual experience of losing both his games. Both he and R. K. Bell had difficulty in steering a straight course, though Humphreys was able by his fine short play to be three holes ahead at the ninth. Then he faltered and he lost six of the remaining holes. In contrast A. E. Billington, making his first appearance for the county, had a good day. He and J. T. Lambie maintained their unbeaten record in foursomes since they became associated some seasons ago, and in the afternoon he had the fine figures of 4, 4, 4, 4, at the finish of his match against B. Stockdale. He was the only player during the day to reach the green in two at the 466-yard-long fifteenth, the most testing hole against the wind. Details (Cheshire first):
