



A STRONG HOYLAKE PLAYER

CHARLES W. TIMMIS, of Hoylake, drives a very long ball from the tee. He has a particularly wide pivot from the hips, his hands being flung very high at the top of the swing, where the club just reaches the horizontal. During the stroke there is considerable transference of weight, as is seen by the rather exaggerated raising of the left foot at the top of the back swing. The right knee is more bent than is strictly orthodox and the right elbow comes rather high, but the stroke is an easy, flowing one, pleasant to look at and endowed with plenty of power. Timmis's only serious fault is a distinct sway when putting; a fault of which he is trying to cure himself.
