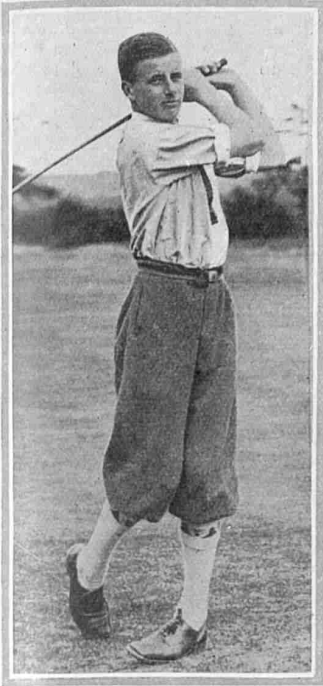

BEATEN IN SEMI-FINAL: H. C. FORBES (LEVEN).



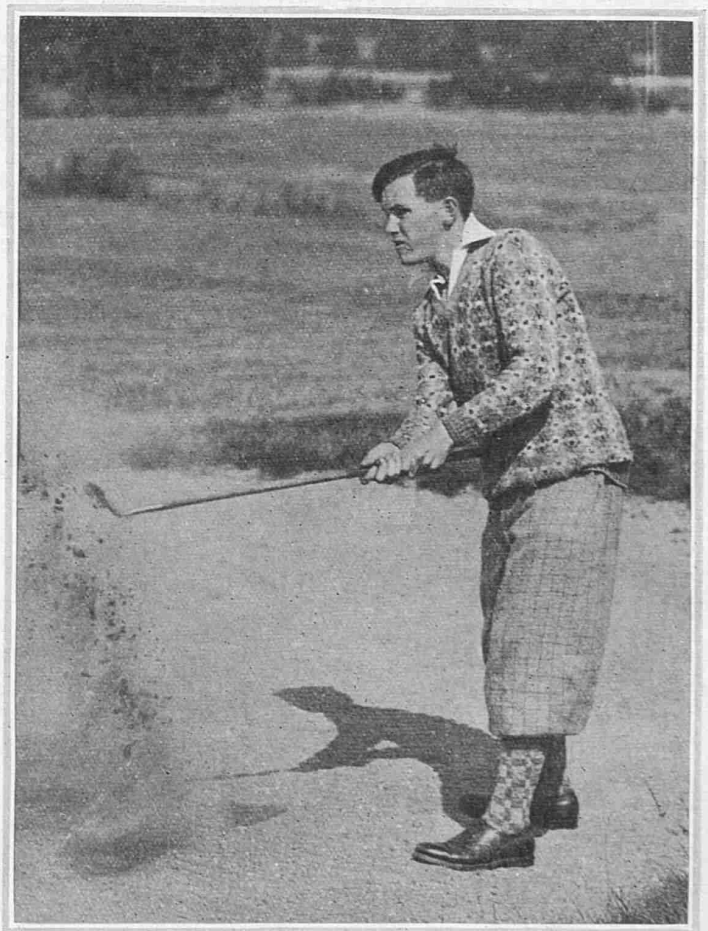
