# Yorkshire Easily Beat Cheshire.

### NEW PLAYERS' SUCCESS.

Yorkshire beat Cheshire in the amateur inter-county golf match on Saturday on the Huddersfield links at Fixby by 14 matches to 4, and thus avenged the defeat at Ringway early in May when Cheshire's margin was 11 matches to 5. Several new players were introduced into the sides, and Yorkshire's "freshers" were successful.

The Fixby course has always had the reputation of being one on which visiting teams are at a disadvantage, and many recent alterations added to the difficulties of the Cheshire men who had been unable to play a trial round, whereas most of the Yorkshire men played over the links on the eve of the match.

Yorkshire laid the foundation of their victory by taking five of the six foursomes in the morning. Cheshire's sole success was gained by K. Stoker and Alan Macbeth, who won on the last green where their opponents missed a putt of less than a yard to win the hole and laid a stymie which Macbeth beat with a lofted shot. The winners at one time looked likely to have an easy victory, as they were five up with seven to play. In the singles I. Sidebottom played at the head for Cheshire in the absence of the champion, W. Sutton, the West Cheshire artisan, but failed against N. W. Dunn, the Yorkshire title-holder, after taking the match to the last green. Sidebottom was four down at the eighth, won the ninth, and from that point played excellently. He won the tenth—holing a long curly putt,—the twelfth, and thirteenth, and was unlucky to lose the short eleventh. He was one down with five of the remaining holes. A. Macbeth made a great fight against B. Wragg, a past Yorkshire champion, and was not beaten until the eighteenth hole had been played. K. Stoker, who has the best record of all the Cheshire players in county games, was again successful, and G. Tweedale did well to beat C. Hodgson. Tweedale led at the turn by one hole, and had to maintain very good form to win the match by two and one, as on the homeward journey neither player had anything worse than a four.

C. K. Parker, who has done well since being introduced into the Cheshire team last year, gained the other victory for the visitors. E. A. Lassen beat White, of Wallasey, by one hole after losing four of the first six holes. Details:—
